






## FACTS MUNICIPAL OFFICIALS SHOULD KNOW



### THREE BASIC FACTS


- Each of Pennsylvania's 2560 municipalities is located within a PennDOT Engineering District





#### FINANCIAL CONSULTANT COVERAGE AREAS







### MSR ROLES – AN OVERVIEW

#### **Roles:**

- Liquid Fuels
- Provide Technical Assistance
- Assist with Funding Programs
- Local Government Liaison

- MSRs are responsible for oversight and approval of Liquid Fuels funding
- Allocations set by legislation
  - Counties: County Liquid Fuels Tax Act of 1931
  - Municipalities: Legislative Act 655 of 1956

#### • 2023 MLF Distribution: \$470,202,682

- 50% Mileage: \$3,211.1431/mile
- 50% Population: \$18.0810/Capita

#### 2024 MLF Estimated Allocation: \$462,420,000

- 50% Mileage: \$3,157.9931/mile
- 50% Population: \$17.7817/Capita





### PENNDOT MAINTENANCE

- Each District has a Maintenance Unit
  - Coordinates work on State Routes (SRs)
  - Does an annual survey of all routes to plan improvements
- Follows the Maintenance Business Model
  - Recurring Cycles
    - Cyclical Network Preservation
      - · Completed at the same predetermined locations over a period of years
      - Examples: Sealcoat, Crack Seal, Shoulder Cutting, Drainage, etc.
      - Often done sectionally to increase efficiency and decrease mobilization
    - Cyclical Condition Maintenance
      - Completed annually at the same predetermined locations
      - Examples: Mowing, Bridge Cleaning, Roadway Sweeping, etc.
  - On-Demand
    - Completed as needed based on condition or need
    - Examples: Pothole Patching, Litter/Debris Removal, etc.



PennDOT Maintenance Business Model

Commonly known as "oil and chip" or "sealcoat", this operation is a preservation strategy used to maintain mainly low-traffic volume roads for a 5 to 7-year period. It is also used on high-volume roads to extend pavement life between resurfacings.

This activity is performed when temps are greater than 60 degrees, generally from April through September. Surface treatment requires a sweeper, oil distributors, a stone chipper, rollers, dump trucks and a crew comprise of approximately 21 crew members.

The operation begins with the roadway being swept clean of debris. Then, emulsion oil is applied with a layer of stone immediately placed on top. It is rolled into place and any loose aggregate is swept from the roadway once cured.

Generally, it takes about two days for the stones to fully bond in the hardened asphalt. Motorists should reduce their speed on these roads until the stone and the asphalt fully adhere.

This maintenance treatment seals the road surface to keep water out, restores the friction of the surface to enhance traction and is very cost effective.
